# Educational Exhibit (electronic)

## Authorship:

- First author can be a Full, International, Emeritus, or MIT Member in good standing, OR a current resident in good standing in an accredited US or Canadian diagnostic or interventional radiology program.
- For submissions by an MIT Member or resident, one of the authors must be a sponsoring Full, International, or Emeritus SSR member in good standing.
- The first author (and sponsor for an MIT or resident submission) must be registered for the Annual Meeting (in person or virtually).

### Content:

- Education exhibits are organized, illustrated reviews of a topic related to musculoskeletal radiology.
- Educational exhibits should not have already been presented at or accepted for another meeting or venue.
- Single case reports, with or without a review of the literature will not be accepted as educational exhibits. Authors may choose to submit them as Case-of-the-Day presentations, if they fulfill the requirements (see COD Guidelines).

### Abstract format:

- Title
- Background: Concise statement of the topic
- Objectives: 2 or 3 learning goals for the viewer
- Outline: Organization or Table-of-Contents for the exhibit
- Conclusion: At least 3 take-home points
- Maximum word count (Background/Objectives/Outline/Conclusion): 300 words
- (Optional) References (2 maximum, does not count towards word total)
- (Optional) Figures (2 maximum): radiologic image, table, chart, or graphic

### Awards:

• One educational exhibit submitted by an SSR or MIT member will be selected for the ACR Educational award. <u>See the SSR web site for award criteria.</u>
