Resident Scientific Abstract (podium or electronic)

Authorship:

- Presenting author must be a current resident in good standing in an accredited US or Canadian diagnostic or interventional radiology program
- A sponsoring SSR member must be one of the authors.
- For accepted podium (oral) presentations, the resident author and sponsoring SSR member must both register for the Annual Meeting, and be physically present for the presentation.
- For accepted electronic (poster) presentations, the resident author and sponsor must both be registered for the Annual Meeting, either as a live participant, or virtually.

Content:

- Abstracts should detail an original scientific research project, adhering to standard principles of IRB approval, informed consent, and disclosure of any commercial interests or conflicts-of-interest.
- All data collection and initial data analysis should be completed at the time of abstract submission. "Promissory notes" with absent or incomplete data will not be accepted.
- Single case reports, with or without a review of the literature will not be accepted as scientific abstracts. Authors may choose to submit them as Case-of-the-Day presentations, if they fulfill the requirements (see COD Guidelines).
- Accepted podium (oral) presentations will be presented at specially designated sessions during the Annual Meeting and strictly limited to a 6minute presentation with 3 additional minutes allotted for questions/discussion. Complete instructions for speaker and paper presentation will be provided upon notification of a paper's acceptance.
- Submitted abstracts that are not accepted for podium (oral) presentation will automatically be evaluated for presentation in an electronic poster format. If accepted as a poster, authors will have the option of whether or not to accept the offer to present the abstract in electronic format.
- Authors also have the option to submit abstracts to be considered only for electronic poster format.

Abstract format:

- Title
- Standard scientific sections: Purpose, Materials and Methods, Results, Conclusion (maximum 300 words total)
- (Optional) References (2 maximum, does not count towards word total)
- (Optional) Figures (2 maximum): radiologic image, table, chart, or graphic

Awards:

 The submitted abstract that is judged best will be given a special presentation spot during the Annual Meeting and will be given as a 10minute presentation with an additional 5 minutes for questions and discussion and awarded a certificate. The winner will be informed before the Annual Meeting.
